THE FIRST WAVE

After a busy and fruitful 2023 season, our J1 students have returned home to their native countries. Our next wave of 2024 students from Peru is arriving this month. Because N4C recently became a yearlong outreach, there has been an active student cycle in Pigeon Forge. Since last December we have been working with students who travel to Pigeon Forge and plan to stay until March of that year. Here you can see Alexey exploring downtown Knoxville with a group of young Peruvian technical and medical professionals, witnessing to them about his faith in Christ. None of them had any

While they were enjoying lunch together, Alexey shared about a church service with modern worship, Bible study, and youth ministry, and some students asked if they could join the Kochan family to see that church service.

The following Sunday morning, Alexey arrived at Pigeon Forge to pick up his new Peruvian friends for their first ever church encounter. After a busy week at jobs that require hard physical labor, it was not an easy task for the students to get out of their cozy beds so early in the morning. Thankfully, they did, and they were richly rewarded with an amazing day!

While the first wave from Central America was heading home, a new wave of students came in late March. In the photos below, Alexey picked up new guests from Thailand.



These two students asked Alexey to call them Nook and Lee, as their real names are in Thai and are pronounced with five tones. Their language almost sounds like birdsong and is very difficult to replicate no matter how hard you try, so those nicknames worked for us! Nook and Lee flew in at night, and Alexey picked them up at 7 AM. It turned out that they were starving, so they made an emergency stop at McDonald's. Because they were going to work at a Steak and Shake for the next 3 months, the girls were excited to try their first - but not last - burger on American soil!

The next stop was at the Embassy. When students first land in Tennessee, they are wide open to the presentation of the Gospel as they are away from home and out of their comfort zone.

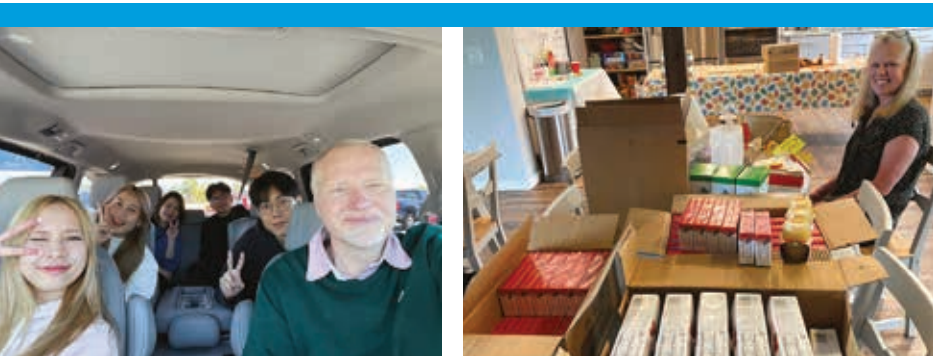
The girls were excited to see the Embassy, especially the kitchen, and said that they were looking forward to cooking a Thai meal for one of



our international outreach nights. That same day on his way back to Knoxville, Alexey gave a ride to Peruvian students who arrived in December of 2022 and were now traveling back home. On the way to the bus



station, they also asked to go to McDonald's, where they had a great time of fellowship and prayer. Thank you for all your financial support, as it puts gas in our vehicles and makes these types of evenings possible!



Beth and Jennifer from Evergreen Church worked hard to pack welcome bags for students. These had snacks, a bottle of water, some Christian tracts, and information about the Embassy. Thank you for your hard work and for showing such great Christian hospitality to these kids! Being served in this way is a very new experience for students and it helps to open them up to the Gospel.



Late spring and the beginning of summer are still our peak season, as most students arrive in this wave. In the last two years, many of these have been Mongolian. One of our outreach evenings started with our seasonal volunteer prayer meeting, with fellowship and a dinner. Shortly after this meeting ended, the Mongolian students arrived. We were very happy to give them welcome bags, drinks, and light snacks, and while the students were very tired from their travels, they also didn't want to leave. That night we established great connections and friendships with them.

CHURCH ON WHEELS

This year 2,000 students arrived in Pigeon Forge, and our goal was for all of them to hear the Gospel at least once.

In addition to our weekly outreach events in June and July, each Tuesday we would take students for a trip to Knoxville to help them with their social security needs and then presented the Gospel right after. Visiting the social security office is a necessity to work in the US, so we got a very wide reach to students who might not have shown up to the Embassy otherwise. These trips really helped us with our goal, as students would show

up hungry and leave spiritually fed, and often, they ended up coming with us to our outreach events afterwards.

Transporting large groups of students is very important, so we are very grateful to our

amazing volunteers. Pictured above is Herb from the East Maryville Mission committee, who drove their church van to give students a ride to Knoxville

and back, and then swapped with Kelvin to bring the students' home. In recent years, students' living places have spread out between Pigeon Forge and Gatlinburg, and since they didn't have their own means of transportation, they needed help getting to and from outreach events.

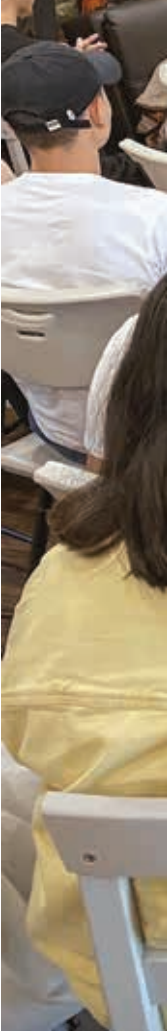
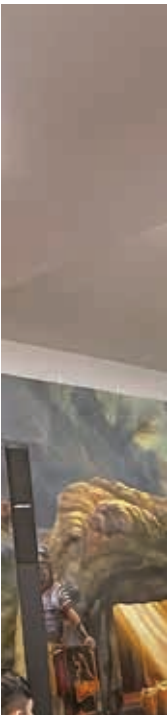
and supporters for your contributions and for putting food on our tables!

All our activities are tied to the Gospel. Christmas is not celebrated in most of the countries that our students come from, so to them, experiencing this different holiday and culture is a very big deal. A few years ago we decided to split up our Christmas in June event into two parts - preparation, where we invite students to decorate the Embassy and tell them what Christmas is about, and the celebration itself. We held the preparation half in the first week of June with Thai, Mongolian and Dominican students.

After dinner, we started our evangelism program with brief worship. Later, a student from Mongolia approached Alexey and told him that he was a professional musician who played guitar and drums, and that he wanted to join our worship band.

Most of our students have never read or owned a Bible, so Alexey always starts his presentations with an explanation of the Bible. In this photo he showed them what the Bible app is, how to install it, and how to use it. All the students in the

group installed the app and got to read the Bible in their native language. That day they studied the first chapter of Luke, where Gabriel appeared to Mary. This is how the students learned that Christ is the true meaning of Christmas.



Look at how beautiful the Embassy looked! We left the decorations up throughout the month and hosted the second half of our Christmas celebration on the 20th of June. Many more students got to experience it - especially the ones from Turkey, Jordan, Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan that arrived just in time to participate!

HISTORY LESSON

APPROACHING AN ATHEIST

"THE SISTINE CHAPEL OF CAVE ART" IS A COMMON NAME FOR ONE OF THE MOST FAMOUS CAVES IN THE WORLD - ALTAMIRA, LOCATED IN NORTHERN SPAIN. IT WAS A STUMBLING BLOCK FOR THE SCIENTIFIC COMMUNITY AND A CHALLENGE FOR THE CONSCIENCE OF ITS REPRESENTATIVES.

The Altamira cave was discovered by accident in 1868. A hunter who lost his dog was searching for his pet and heard it whining underground. Upon moving a large stone, the hunter found a crevice, and soon after, the cave. The discovery was reported to the landowner - archaeology-loving Marcelino de Sautuola, who then decided to unearth Altamira himself. Many different objects were found inside, but most amazingly, ancient bison, horses, boars, mammoths, members of the cat family, deer, and even handprints were all "dancing" on the ceiling...

The drawings were done masterfully - the ancient artist carved out the drawings with a chisel, then painted on top with natural paints - the result was a colorful bas-relief. A small dip was found in the ground nearby, which served as a palette for the artist. Amazingly, the ancient masters were already using techniques that were "discovered" by the



impressionists in the 19th century! This was sensational! "After Altamira, everything is decadence - no other modern artist can create something like this!" exclaimed Pablo Picasso upon visiting the cave.

The scientific community, however, did not receive the discovery as warmly. The scientific world stubbornly ignored the cave's existence. How could it be that the ancient man was creative, talented, capable of planning, and possessing an aesthetic taste? These drawings completely flew in the face of their theory of evolution.

My whole life I was taught that these drawings were created by prehistoric people who looked more like monkeys than me. So I decided to replicate these paintings myself, like a little challenge - it wouldn't be too hard for a professional artist to replicate what monkeys were able to do, right?



Paints were made using animal and plant oils, and pigmented with ocher, kaolin, manganese, and coal pine. In theory, paint was applied with a finger wrapped in fur. So, I decided to follow the precedent set by my ancient colleagues and created some paint with my own fingers. Well, as you can probably guess, nothing worked for me at first. I quickly realize - It takes no small amount of talent and imagination to make stylized images. I was simply copying an already created image, but even that was already very difficult! My copied lines, the original so easily created by an ancient artist, could not at all convey the style or the charm of Altamira. I would get angry and restart the work. But the ancient artist didn't have that luxury - he just made the drawing with one move of his brush. After this experiment, I had no other conclusion that whoever drew this was just as smart as I was.

For twenty long years, the scientists did not recognize the drawings as authentic.

Sautuola and Madrid University professor Don Juan Vilanova, who supported the archaeologist, became a laughingstock in offices and scientific conferences. But one beautiful day, Kartalyak, who was afraid to admit the truth before, finally repented.

Knowing the atheist mindset of European college graduates who most likely have never had the chance to hear about the Creationism, I tell this story with one goal - to force young smart people to start thinking about an alternative. The seed is planted and God will find a path to their hearts.

INTRODUCING A NEW CHAPTER FOR THE WH EMBASSY

Over the last 15 years, we have been blessed with the opportunity to make Christ known to young professionals from areas of the world where traditional missions have very little impact. For many of these students, this is the only exposure to the Gospel message they will ever have, so we always take our presentations very seriously. Imagine yourself standing in front of a large group of young intellectuals from all corners of the globe, a kaleidoscope of cultures where the only similarity they have is a total ignorance of the Bible.

It is extremely important for a speaker to make the Bible message simple

and well-understood so that an intelligent discussion for Christ can be made. As you can see, cross-cultural evangelism is a complicated task, which is why our team is always prayerfully seeking ways to take our outreach to the next level.

For many years Tanya has been using her artistic talents in this matter by creating unique evangelism tools, like a 17-and-a-half foot salvation plan mural, various art pieces that hang on the walls of the Embassy, and many videos. In the middle of our outreach this summer, God laid Jeremiah 18:1-6 on Alexey's heart:

God gave Alexey an amazing image of how to show His salvation plan to students through a live pottery demonstration at the Embassy - something that they could easily see in front of their eyes in a simple but still deep way.

A few days later Tanya shared with him that God inspired her to study pottery for the ministry. Alexey was speechless - they were in unison about this vision, and this topic had never come up before this point!

Tanya was asked to share a testimony about what God laid on her heart with you all. "International students, like most people, respond very well to visual information. So, we started brainstorming on how to show a multinational, multicultural, and multilingual audience simple but difficult things about God. We did not have to ponder this dilemma for long because God, having foreseen all these questions already, gave us a hint in the Bible. That is how we got the idea to host a special series of presentations for our international students, called 'The Potter's House.' Through live demonstrations at the

Embassy, we will show them a pottery wheel in action and make all sorts of pots right in front of them - big ones, small ones, useful ones, ones you can't go without, ones that aren't so common in use, all with different types of clay. We will break these pots, just so that after removing the stones they can be remade... To visually show that we are all made from the same dirt. That for us to live right, trusting and listening to God is mandatory, and that God tempers us like clay in a furnace! That following the Lord may be difficult, but it is worth the results! And so, this was the complex and multifaceted task that was set before us.

So, I went to a ceramics school and took a 2-month

course, and to the surprise of all the teachers (they asked me if this was really my first time doing pottery) and to the glory of God, I finished as the top student. Now I have the skills and they are being practiced to perfection - I am ready for the next step!”

The first wave of 2024 students is arriving this month, and we would like to begin this project as soon as possible! All that is left now is purchasing the necessary equipment. The estimated cost of this project starts at \$9000 - this starter kit includes the pottery wheel, clay, supplies, and a kiln.

Imagine you have been invited to dinner on Tuesday evening, with folks you barely know. When you approach the house, you hear the sounds of greetings in many different accents and laughter as the door swings open, welcoming you inside. The warm smells of cinnamon, rosemary, garlic, and another aroma you can't quite place, tingle your senses. The tables are decorated festively with some old-style dressed figurines and colored leaves. You see the smiling faces of volunteers working around an overflowing table of mouth-watering food and the biggest baked chickens you have ever laid your eyes on are getting carved. Above all the talking and kitchen noise, you hear, "Shut the door! The air conditioner is on!" Yep, welcome to Thanksgiving in June at the Embassy!

This meal is one of my favorites that we host for the J1 students. Just like preparing for your own family Thanksgiving, we dust off the old recipe cards to give them a traditional Thanksgiving dinner with all the trimmings and fixings. And those 'biggest baked chickens' are brined and smoked turkeys. >

> **B**ut it's more than the food! The Thanksgiving holiday gives us an opportunity to share the true historical story of the Pilgrims and how God miraculously planned for Squanto to be there at just the right time to help the Pilgrims survive that first winter. We tell the students what was served on that first Thanksgiving, that it lasted for 3 days - ours won't, haha! - and 90 plus American Indians and 50 Pilgrims - kind of like our numbers tonight - gathered, played sporting games and enjoyed food together.

The Pilgrims prayed and thanked God for their new friends, for His provisions, and to be able to worship God and His son Jesus! And as the Pilgrims thanked God for their new friends, we let the students know that we thank God for allowing them to be here with us in Sevier County, TN. That it is not by accident, but that He has a reason for them to be working here this summer, to join us for this meal, and that our prayer is that they will want to know who God is too! From these shared meals together at the

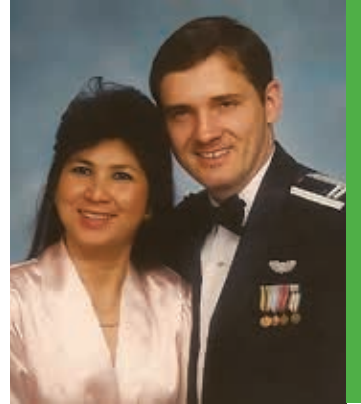
